0017(1)P - Three members from Lakenheath of the Second World War Lakenheath Royal Observer Corps Post.

Sammy Tuffs, George Peckett and Barry Hensby were amongst the 796 selected from 1,376 observers and 29 Officers, who volunteered for service as 'Seaborne' observers aboard 'D.E.M.S.' (Defensively Equipped Merchant Ships) used in the D-Day Landings.

They were enlisted into the Royal Navy for one month with the option of extension to two months, (the majority stayed for two) paid a special rate of £1 a day and given the Rank of Petty Officer. Their ages ranged 17 to 70.

2 observers were killed and 22 survived their ships being sunk. 1 was injured by shell splinters and 1 was injured by a flying bomb when his ship was in dock.

0028P - Mr Presland's Coach 1937 - This includes his coach and horses. Mr Presland and the coachmen are in period dress. The house is decorated with flags and it is hard to see whether the union Flag is attached to the house or the coach. The house seems to be that adjoins what was Matthews Nursery on the corner. Was this the Coronation of King George VI?

0029P - Lakenheath workers. This shows the piling for a culvert under the River Lode. Location approx. at Newmans Drove roughly the sharp left bend after High Bridge. It is near where the Shaft that goes down to the tunnel to Essex. The picture includes George Rutterford on the left, Herb Bennett and Bill crane on the far right.
